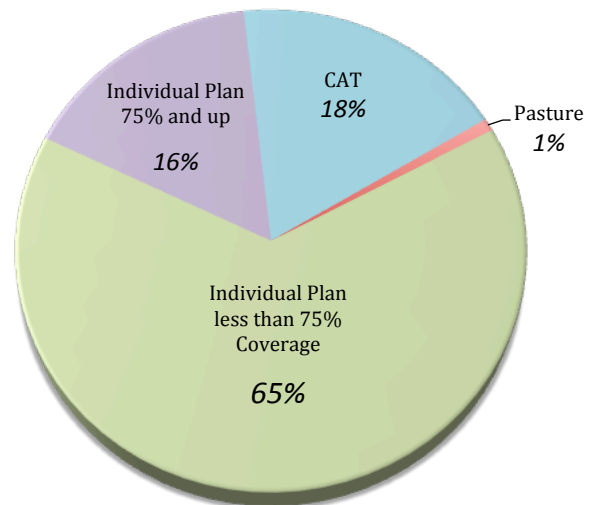


## Crop Insurance

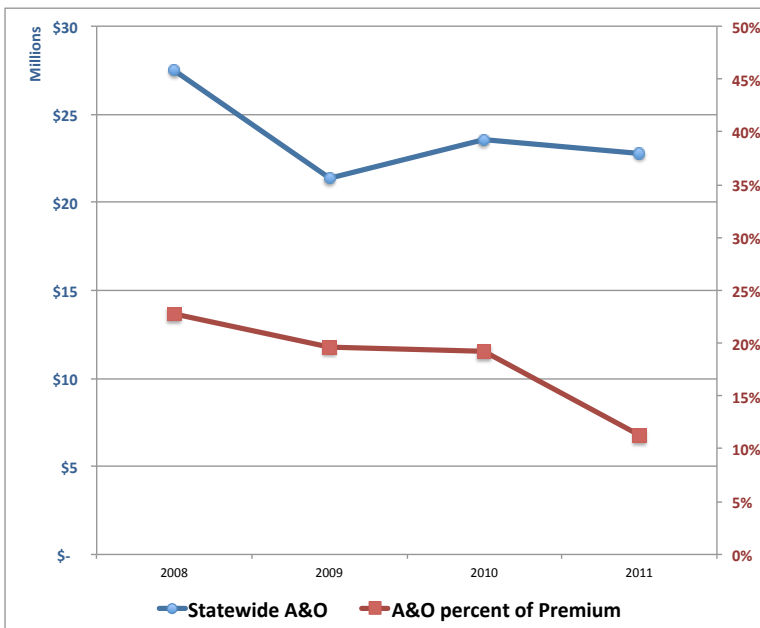

Of the 3.7 million acres planted in Georgia in 2011, 2.6 million or 70% were enrolled in crop insurance. Of the insured acreage, 2.1 million were individual buy-up coverage, with 423,000 (16% of acres; 24% of premiums) with a buy-up level of 75% or greater. Over 478,000 (18%) were in CAT .

### Administrative and Operating Costs



The chart to the left highlights how the cost to the government to administer crop insurance in the state has been drastically cut since 2008, even as total liability within Georgia has increased (from \$1 billion in 2010 to \$1.5 billion in 2011).
